Next Blood Drive - 1/11/11 from 2:00pm - 5:00pm  
 Before picking your child up on that day, why not make a blood donation? In general, you need to be:

- in good health
- 16 years of age, with no upper age limitations.
- 16-year-old donors must weigh 130 pounds, and present a signed parental permission slip, which can be found under the 16-year-old area of the "Can I Donate" section of the RI Blood Center website.
- 17-year-olds must weigh 110 pounds and are not required to present a signed parental permission slip, unless their particular school requires it.

Most medications do not keep you from donating, nor does:

- A tattoo if it was applied in a licensed establishment by a licensed practitioner and is healed and pain free.
- A heart attack. Most individuals can donate again once fully recovered.
- A breast feeding mother six weeks after an uncomplicated birth.

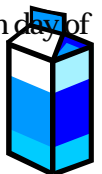

To keep your children safe, teach them:

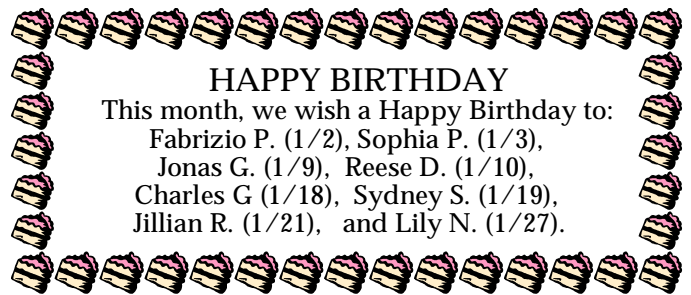
- \* Never use ice for a shortcut.

**Rates Effective January 3, 2011**

**Registration Fee:** A \$75.00 Registration Fee is due at the time of registration. If your child is withdrawn from the program at any time and re-enrolls during the same year, the registration fee will be re-charged. This fee is separate from the tuition fee and is non-refundable. Note: Children not yet toilet trained will pay the 18-36 month fees. Breezy Knoll staff will be accountable for determining when a child is toilet trained. Please refer to the Parent Handbook for details of our Toilet Training Policy.

**Public Kindergarten Program:** drop off from La Perche School, Smithfield, or parent drop off at 12:00pm will be billed at the half day rate of \$149.00 per wk. \*Note: **EXTRA DAY FEES** are to be added if your child attends on a closed (public) school day due to inclement weather (snow day) or other reasons.

**HOURS:** Breezy Knoll will be open for drop off at **7:00 A.M.** and will close for the day at **5:30 P.M.** Any child picked up after **12:15pm (half day) or 5:30pm (full day)** will incur an extra charge of **\$10.00 per child PER 15 MINUTE INCREMENT** (see *Parent Handbook*). The Half Day Program equals 4 hours. Any placement exceeding this time will be billed at a full time rate.

**PAYMENT:** All weekly payments are due on the **first day** of the week that the child attends. Please understand that you will be making a commitment to us, and we in turn, will be making a commitment to our staff. It is, therefore, important that weekly payments be made on time. Payments can also be made bi-monthly and/or monthly. You are responsible for the time that you have registered your child (School Age included), which includes illness or personal vacation. Please note that fees paid reserve and pay for your child's enrollment in our center. Reimbursement will not be made when your child is picked up early, or is absent due to vacation, holidays, illness, snow days, personal, or any other reasons. There will be **NO** switching or exchanging days missed due to absenteeism. Please make checks payable to **Breezy Knoll Child Care Center**. For your tax purposes Breezy Knoll's identification number is **EIN #05 044 0033**. Weekly, monthly, or annual receipts are available upon request. Kindly submit request with your child's tuition.

**LATE FEES AND SERVICE CHARGES:** Payments that run more than **FIVE** days past due will incur a **\$10.00 LATE FEE** charge. Accounts two weeks in arrears will be cause for termination of service to your child. Any checks returned to us for non-payment or insufficient funds will incur a **\$35.00 SERVICE CHARGE FEE**. Continual problems without contact from you will be cause for dismissal.

**DAYS THE CENTER WILL BE CLOSED:** Labor Day; Columbus Day; Veterans' Day; Thanksgiving and Friday following; Christmas Eve Day (closing at 12:00 PM), Christmas Day, New Year's Eve Day (closing at 3:00 PM); New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day; Presidents' Day; Good Friday (for staff development); Memorial Day, July 4,<sup>th</sup> and Victory Day. On Friday, August 26, 2011, the center will be closed to prepare for the new school year. Tuition payment remains the same.
