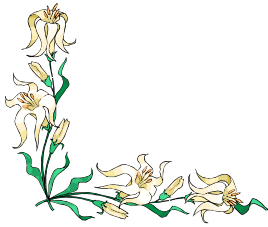

IF I HAD MY CHILD TO RAISE OVER AGAIN

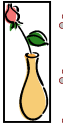
If I had my child to raise over again,

## THE HOT OR COLD GAME from Parents Magazine

**How to play:** Choose one child to be the "Finder." Send him out of the room while the rest of the players hide an object, like a red ball, somewhere in the room. Ask the Finder to come back and look for the ball, while the other players shout out hints: "You're getting hotter" or "you're getting colder." Play until the object is found, then give everyone a turn as the Finder.

**What it teaches:** Cooperation. This game puts the emphasis on encouraging other players, not competing against them, so preschoolers learn to help each other out.

**Parent tip:** Try asking children to speak louder or softer depending on how close or far away the Finder is from the hidden object.

**LEARN THROUGH PLAY** From Fun Family Activities: Science  
Help your child become a scientific thinker:  
observe, collect, describe, and record.

**A Shadow Hunt :** On a sunny day, take your child outside and look for shadows. Have your child find their own shadow. Move around and watch your shadows change. Try standing in your shadow. Then, stand in the light. Ask your child to describe what happens.



Now, look for as many shadows as possible. Observe the shadows made by birds, trees, signs, people, animals, and flowers. Ask your child questions such as, "What has a shadow? When do you see it?"

## FUN IN THE GREAT OUTDOORS From Scholastic Pre-K Today Tips

Spring means sunshine, warm weather, and rediscovering the great outdoors. Many of the activities your child enjoyed indoors during the winter months will have a new twist when done outdoors.

Here are two outdoor activities that are enjoyable and educational and that you and your child can easily do together in your own backyard or at a local park or playground. Remember that as your child tries these activities, he or she will not only have fun, but gain experience with fundamental science concepts, use skills like matching and listening, and express his or her own imagination:

**Spray Bottle Painting:** attach a large piece of paper to a fence or wall. Fill several pump-type spray bottles with water and add food coloring or different-colored tempera paints. Show your child how to pump the spray bottles and aim toward the paper. Discuss the importance of aiming the spray away from oneself and others. Let your child use different colors in succession. As your child squirts the spray bottle, he or she is strengthening finger muscles. This kind of exercise helps your child to refine his or her ability to hold and control a writing or drawing implement.

**Fun With Light Reflections:** This is a great way for your child to experiment with light reflections. Part of the fun is a "light chase" that will challenge your child's eye-hand coordination. This activity is great fun on a sunny day. Collect some small mirrors. Show your child how to hold the mirrors at an angle to create a bright reflection on the outside of your house or another building. Let your child try to make his or her lights chase and catch yours!
